## A BILL

- To reduce the number of preventable deaths and injuries caused by underride crashes, to improve motor carrier and passenger motor vehicle safety, and for other purposes.
  - 1 Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-
  - 2 tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,
  - 3 SECTION 1. SHORT TITLE.
  - 4 This Act may be cited as the "Stop Underrides Act".
  - 5 SEC. 2. FINDINGS AND PURPOSES.
  - 6 (a) FINDINGS.—Congress finds that—
  - 7 (1) underride crashes involving passenger motor
  - 8 vehicles striking and traveling underneath a truck or

1	trailer are a significant public health and safety
2	threat;
3	(2) the National Highway Traffic Safety Ad-
4	ministration has reported that hundreds of prevent-
5	able fatalities and life-threatening injuries have oc-
6	curred as a result of underride crashes;
7	(3) the National Transportation Safety Board
8	has recommended the installation of rear, side, and
9	front underride guards on tractor-trailers and rear
10	and side underride guards on single unit trucks to
11	improve passenger motor vehicle safety; and
12	(4) this Act is introduced in the memory of the
13	thousands of victims of underride crashes, includ-
14	ing—

8	(B) those whose catastrophic injuries dra-
9	matically changed their lives, including Julie

13	(C) those whose precious lives were cut far
14	too short as a result of preventable underride
15	crashes.
16	(b) Purposes.—The purposes of this Act are—
17	(1) to reduce the number of preventable deaths
18	and injuries caused by underride crashes; and
19	(2) to improve motor carrier and passenger
20	motor vehicle safety.
21	SEC. 3. DEFINITIONS.
22	Section 30102(a) of title 49, United States Code, is
23	amended—
24	(1) in the matter preceding paragraph (1), by
25	striking "chapter—" and inserting "chapter:";

1	(2) by redesignating paragraphs (1), (2), (3),
2	(4), (5), (6), (7), (8), (9), (10), (11), (12), and (13)
3	as paragraphs (2), (3), (4), (5), (7), (8), (9), (10),
4	(11), (12), (15), (20), and (22), respectively;
5	(3) by inserting before paragraph (2) (as so re-
6	designated) the following:
7	"(1) 'comprehensive underride protection sys-
8	tem' means all of the front underride guards, rear
9	underride guards, or side underride guards, as appli-
10	cable, installed on a motor vehicle.";
11	(4) by inserting after paragraph (5) (as so re-
12	designated) the following:
13	"(6) 'front underride guard' means a device in-
14	stalled on or near the front of a motor vehicle that
15	prevents or limits the distance that a vehicle struck
16	by the vehicle with the device will slide under the
17	front of the striking vehicle.";
18	(5) by inserting after paragraph (12) (as so re-
19	designated) the following:
20	"(13) 'passenger motor vehicle' has the mean-
21	ing given that term in section 32101.
22	"(14) 'rear underride guard' means a device in-
23	stalled on or near the rear of a motor vehicle that
24	prevents or limits the distance that the front end of
25	a vehicle striking the rear of the vehicle with the de-

1	vice will slide under the rear of the impacted vehi-
2	cle.";
3	(6) by inserting after paragraph (15) (as so re-
4	designated) the following:
5	"(16) 'Secretary' means the Secretary of Trans-
6	portation.
7	"(17) 'semi-trailer' means a trailer, other than
8	a pole trailer, which is designed to rest upon, or be
9	carried by, a motor vehicle.
10	"(18) 'side underride guard' means a device in-
11	stalled on or near the side of a motor vehicle that
12	prevents or limits the distance that the front end of
13	a vehicle striking the side of the vehicle with the de-
14	vice will slide under the side of the impacted vehicle
15	"(19) 'single unit truck' means a truck (exclud-
16	ing any attached trailer).";
17	(7) by inserting after paragraph (20) (as so re-
18	designated) the following:
19	"(21) 'trailer' means a vehicle, with or without
20	motive power, that is designed—
21	"(A) to carry persons or property; and
22	"(B) to be drawn by a motor vehicle.";
23	(8) by inserting "The term" after the para-
24	graph designation in each of paragraphs (1) through
25	(22) (as so redesignated); and

1	(9) in each of paragraphs $(1)$ through $(22)$ (as
2	so redesignated), by inserting a paragraph heading
3	the text of which is comprised of the term defined
4	in the paragraph.
5	SEC. 4. UNDERRIDE GUARD RULEMAKING.
6	(a) In General.—Subchapter II of chapter 301 of
7	title 49, United States Code, is amended by adding at the
8	end the following:
9	"§ 30129. Underride guards
10	"(a) Rear Underride Guards.—
11	"(1) IN GENERAL.—Not later than 1 year after
12	the date of enactment of this section, the Secretary
13	shall issue a final rule to require the installation of
14	rear underride guards that meet the performance
15	standards described in paragraph (2) on—
16	"(A) any trailer with a gross vehicle weight
17	rating of 10,000 pounds or more that is manu-
18	factured on or after the effective date of the
19	rule;
20	"(B) any semi-trailer with a gross vehicle
21	weight rating of 10,000 pounds or more that is
22	manufactured on or after the effective date of
23	the rule; and
24	"(C) any single unit truck—

"(1) the bottom of the carriage of
which is greater than 22 inches above the
ground;
"(ii) with a gross vehicle weight rating
of 10,000 pounds or more; and
"(iii) that is manufactured on or after
the effective date of the rule.
"(2) Performance standards.—A rear
underride guard shall be considered to meet the per-
formance standard referred to in paragraph (1) if
the rear underride guard is able to prevent intrusion
from the body or frame of a vehicle described in that
paragraph into the passenger compartment of a pas-
senger motor vehicle that contacts the guard while
traveling at 35 miles per hour, as verified through
crash testing while attached to a trailer, after—
"(A) an impact in which the passenger ve-
hicle impacts the center of the rear of the trail-
er, semi-trailer, or single unit truck;
"(B) an impact in which 50 percent of the
width of the passenger vehicle overlaps the rear
of the trailer, semi-trailer, or single unit truck;
and

1	(C) an impact in which 30 percent of the
2	width of the passenger vehicle overlaps the rear
3	of the trailer, semi-trailer, or single unit truck.
4	"(3) Compliance date.—Compliance with the
5	rule issued by the Secretary under paragraph (1)
6	shall be required beginning 1 year after the date on
7	which the final rule is published in the Federal Reg-
8	ister.
9	"(b) Side Underride Guards.—
10	"(1) IN GENERAL.—Not later than 1 year after
11	the date of enactment of this section, the Secretary
12	shall issue a final rule requiring the installation of
13	side underride guards that meet the performance
14	standards described in paragraph (2) on—
15	"(A) any trailer with a gross vehicle weight
16	rating of 10,000 pounds or more that is manu-
17	factured on or after the effective date of the
18	rule;
19	"(B) any semi-trailer with a gross vehicle
20	weight rating of 10,000 pounds or more that is
21	manufactured on or after the effective date of
22	the rule; and
23	"(C) any single unit truck—

1	"(i) the bottom of the carriage of
2	which is greater than 22 inches above the
3	ground;
4	"(ii) with a gross vehicle weight rating
5	of 10,000 pounds or more; and
6	"(iii) that is manufactured on or after
7	the effective date of the rule.
8	"(2) Performance standards.—A side
9	underride guard shall be considered to meet the per-
10	formance standards referred to in paragraph (1) if
11	the side underride guard is able to prevent intrusion
12	from the body or frame of a vehicle described in that
13	paragraph into the passenger compartment of a pas-
14	senger motor vehicle that contacts the guard while
15	traveling 35 miles per hour at any angle between 10
16	degrees and 90 degrees.
17	"(3) COMPLIANCE DATE.—Compliance with the
18	rule issued by the Secretary under paragraph (1)
19	shall be required beginning on the date that is 1
20	year after the date on which the final rule is pub-
21	lished in the Federal Register.
22	"(c) Front Underride Guards.—
23	"(1) In general.—Not later than 2 years
24	after the date of enactment of this section, the Sec-

1	retary shall issue a final rule requiring the installa-
2	tion of front underride guards on—
3	"(A) any semi-truck with a gross vehicle
4	weight rating of 10,000 pounds or more that is
5	manufactured on or after the effective date of
6	the rule; and
7	"(B) any single unit truck—
8	"(i) the bottom of the carriage of
9	which is greater than 22 inches above the
10	ground;
11	"(ii) with a gross vehicle weight rating
12	of 10,000 pounds or more; and
13	"(iii) that is manufactured on or after
14	the effective date of the rule.
15	"(2) COMPLIANCE DATE.—Compliance with the
16	rule issued by the Secretary under paragraph (1)
17	shall be required beginning on the date that is 1
18	year after the date on which the final rule is pub-
19	lished in the Federal Register.
20	"(3) Report.—Not later than 1 year after the
21	date of enactment of this section, the Secretary
22	shall—
23	"(A) complete research on equipping the
24	vehicles described in paragraph (1) with a front

1	underride guard to prevent trucks from over
2	riding the passenger vehicle; and
3	"(B) submit to the Committee on Com
4	merce, Science, and Transportation of the Sen
5	ate and the Committees on Transportation and
6	Infrastructure and Energy and Commerce of
7	the House of Representatives a report on the
8	research described in subparagraph (A).
9	"(d) Inspection and Repair Requirements.—
10	"(1) Post-accident inspections.—To ensure
11	that all trailers, semi-trailers, and single unit trucks
12	are maintained in safe and proper operating condi
13	tion at all times, the Secretary shall require that any
14	trailer, semi-trailer, or single unit truck involved in
15	an accident (as defined in section 390.5 of title 49
16	Code of Federal Regulations (or a successor regula
17	tion)) undergo and pass an inspection described in
18	appendix G to subchapter B of chapter III of title
19	49, Code of Federal Regulations (or successor regu
20	lations), to certify that all components of the trailer
21	semi-trailer, or single unit truck, as applicable, are
22	in safe and proper operating condition.
23	"(2) Pre-trip inspections.—The Secretary
24	shall require drivers—

1	"(A) to conduct a pre-trip inspection of the
2	comprehensive underride protection system re-
3	quired under this section on their trailer, semi-
4	trailer, or single unit truck—
5	"(i) to identify—
6	"(I) any metal perforated by rust
7	or corrosion that compromises struc-
8	tural integrity;
9	``(II) cracked welds;
10	"(III) cracked or fractured
11	vertical members;
12	"(IV) cuts and tears in any
13	underride guard; and
14	"(V) missing fasteners and loose
15	fasteners; and
16	"(ii) to ensure the dimensional integ-
17	rity of those guards;
18	"(B) to include the results of the inspec-
19	tion described in subparagraph (A) in the driver
20	vehicle inspection report; and
21	"(C) to complete any necessary repairs to,
22	or replacement of, the underride protection sys-
23	tem before the vehicle is operated.".
24	(b) Clerical Amendment.—The chapter analysis
25	for chapter 301 of title 49, United States Code, is amend-

1	(4) appendix G to subchapter B of chapter III
2	of title 49, Code of Federal Regulations—
3	(A) by redesignating paragraphs 6 (relat-
4	ing to safe loading) through 14 (relating to mo-
5	torcoach seats) as paragraphs 7 through 15, re-
6	spectively; and
7	(B) by inserting after paragraph 5 (relat-
8	ing to lighting devices) the following:
9	"6. Rear impact guards and rear end pro-
10	TECTION.—Any trailer or semitrailer required under
11	section 393.86 to be equipped with a rear impact
12	guard or rear end protection—
13	"(A) that does not meet the requirements
14	under section 393.86;
15	"(B) that—
16	"(i) is missing; or
17	"(ii) has—
18	"(I) any metal perforated by rust
19	or corrosion that compromises struc-
20	tural integrity;
21	"(II) a cracked weld;
22	"(III) a cracked or fractured
23	vertical member;

25	underride guard component; or

"(V) a missing fastener or a
loose fastener; or
"(C) for which the dimensional integrity of
the guard or protection is compromised.".
SEC. 5. RESEARCH AND PERIODIC REVIEW OF UNDERRIDE
GUARD STANDARDS.
(a) Request for Proposals.—As soon as prac-
ticable, the Secretary of Transportation (referred to in
this section as the "Secretary") shall issue a Request for
Proposals for the design of 2 high-capacity rear underride
barrier prototypes of a generic guard (with energy absorp-
tion and without energy absorption) to prevent underride
crashes and protect motor vehicle passengers against se-
vere injury at crash speeds of up to 65 miles per hour.
(b) EVALUATION.—The Secretary shall—
(1) evaluate the proposals received in response
to the Request for Proposals issued pursuant to sub-
section (a); and
(2) update the underride guard standards
under section 30129 of title 49, United States Code
(as added by section 4(a)), as appropriate, to pro-
vide the best underride protection that is techno-
logically feasible.
(c) Periodic Reviews.—

1	(1) IN GENERAL.—At such times as the Sec-
2	retary determines to be appropriate, the Secretary
3	may—
4	(A) conduct a review of underride guard
5	standards to evaluate the need for changes in
6	response to advancements in technology; and
7	(B) upgrade the standards accordingly.
8	(2) Report.—After each review conducted
9	under this subsection, the Secretary shall submit to
10	the Committee on Commerce, Science, and Trans-
11	portation of the Senate and the Committees on
12	Transportation and Infrastructure and Energy and
13	Commerce of the House of Representatives a report
14	on the results of the review.
15	SEC. 6. COMMITTEE ON UNDERRIDE PROTECTION.
16	(a) Establishment.—The Secretary of Transpor-
17	tation shall establish the Committee on Underride Protec-
18	tion (referred to in this section as the "Committee") to
19	monitor the ongoing underride rulemaking process.
20	(b) Representation.—The Committee shall be
21	composed of—
22	(1) 1 representative of truck manufacturers;
23	(2) 1 representative of trailer manufacturers;
24	(3) 1 roadside inspector;

1	(4) 1 motor vehicle engineer, who shall be a
2	technician who works on motor vehicle safety im-
3	provements;
4	(5) 1 motor vehicle crash reconstructionist;
5	(6) 2 representatives of consumer-oriented traf-
6	fic safety organizations;
7	(7) 1 representative of the truck and auto in-
8	surance industry;
9	(8) 1 law enforcement crash investigator;
10	(9) 1 emergency medical service provider;
11	(10) 1 public health or injury prevention profes-
12	sional; and
13	(11) at least 4 people whose families have been
14	impacted by an underride crash.
15	(c) Meetings.—The Committee shall meet—
16	(1) until the final rules have been issued pursu-
17	ant to section 30129 of title 49, United States Code
18	(as added by section 4(a))—
19	(A) monthly, via conference call; and
20	(B) quarterly, in person, at the Depart-
21	ment of Transportation headquarters; and
22	(2) subsequent to the issuance of the final rules
23	described in paragraph (1), annually, at the Depart-
24	ment of Transportation headquarters, to assess the
25	status of underride crash protection.

1	(d) Annual Report.—The Committee shall submit
2	an annual report to the appropriate congressional commit-
3	tees that describes the progress made by the Secretary of
4	Transportation in meeting the rulemaking deadlines set
5	forth in section 30129 of title 49, United States Code (as
6	added by section 4(a)).
